EarlyLearn (Birth - 2 Years Old)

For eligible families, there are EarlyLearn programs for children from birth to two years old.

- Email earlylearn@schools.nyc.gov to find out if your family qualifies and to learn more about programs.

3-K (3 Years Old) | Pre-K (4 Years Old)

Learn about 3-K programs for children who turn three in 2020. There is a pre-K seat for every child who turns four in 2020.

- Reach out to your Family Welcome Center to learn about 3-K or pre-K options and enroll.
- Extended day/year programs for 3-K and pre-K are available for children who qualify based on family income and needs. Contact a Family Welcome Center to learn about these programs and find out if your family qualifies.

Elementary School | Middle School

There is a kindergarten seat for every child who turns five in 2020. Students who have completed fifth grade can start middle school. Most children attend their zoned school for elementary or middle school.

- If you have a zoned school, contact your zoned school directly to enroll during the school year. On the next page, learn how to find your zoned school.
- If you don't have a zoned school or would like to explore other options, contact your Family Welcome Center to learn about schools and enroll.

High School

Students who have completed eighth grade can start high school.

- Contact your Family Welcome Center to discuss school options and enroll.

Back to School: Frequently Asked Questions

How do I find my school district or learn if I have a zoned school?

Call **311** or enter your address at schools.nyc.gov/Find-a-School. Your child may have a priority to attend certain schools, such as their zoned school and schools in their district or borough.

What is the difference between a MySchools and MyStudent account?

 **MySchools.nyc** is the place where you can search for and learn about specific schools (and apply to school during set application periods). **MyStudent.nyc** is the place where families of current DOE students can access their NYC Schools Account and see their children's academic information, such as grades and attendance.

How can I request a remote learning device?
